

New Puppy Supplies Checklist

- Puppy food** - Remember to check with the breeder, shelter, or other person who fed the puppy to see what they were feeding her.
- Food dish** - Choose an appropriate size for your puppy. If the ears are long, choose a deep bowl with a narrow top.
- Water dish** - Stainless steel and ceramic bowls and dishes are fine. Try to avoid plastic bowls since some dogs can be allergic to plastic.
- Collar** - For a proper fit, allow a space to fit two fingers between the collar and your puppy's neck.
- Leash** - Start with a standard six-foot leash.
- Stuffed toy** - Try to get one of the plush toys that does not actually have stuffing in them. Those tend to last longer.
- Rope toy** - A small rope toy can help keep your puppy's teeth clean.
- Chew toy** - Get something like a Nylabone that can last your puppy for a while.
- Kong toy** - You can fill a Kong type toy with peanut butter and other goodies to keep your puppy entertained for a while.
- Crate** - Choose a crate that your puppy can grow into. You can always section off a side of the crate to start.
- Bed** - Beds are a matter of personal taste. Just make sure to choose one large enough to accommodate your puppy.
